
































Hamburg

In 1960, Astrid Kitchherr goes with her friend Klaus Voorman to the Kaiserkeller Club in Hamburg, where the Beatles (at that time, John, Paul, George, Pete Best and Stuart Sutcliffe) are performing. On the occasion, she takes the first professional photos of the group.



After meeting Astrid, Stuart decides to remain with her in Hamburg, where he devotes himself to his career as an artist. He leaves the Beatles in 1961. But in 1962, he dies from a brain hemorrhage, three days after the group's return to Germany. He was only 21 years old. Astrid is devastate; john, as well. He alludes to his friend's death in several songs, especially on In My Life (on the album Rubber Soul, in 1965).

On November 4, 1963, the four musicians from Liverpool perform in the presence of the royal family at London's Prince of Wales Theatre, for the Royal Variety Performance, an annual gala. Nineteen stars are on display that memorable night, including Marlene Dietrich. The



















No more tours. At the end of 1966, the Beatles practically move into the Abby Road EMI Studies full time. It's the beginning of their "studio years". They have fun throwing tape bands on the ground, gluing them together, playing bits backwards, sped up, mixing many kinds

of instruments, from traditional ones to all kinds of keyboards, to calling upon orchestras. For many, the Beatles's true masterpiece is the album "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band", released on June 1. 1967.
















Who are you, Yoko?

The Japanese Yoko is an artist in her own right. She distinguishes herself in different domains: an experimental artist, a visual artist, poet, performance artist, musician, singer, composer, writer, stage actress, and film director.

She is a crucial member of the New York avant-garde scene in the Sixties. She develops alongside artists like John Cage and even Marcel Duchamp.

She participated especially in one of the most important artistic trends in the 20th century, Fluxus, a movement connected with both the visual arts as well as music and literature, through the realization of concerts, events, the production of books, magazines, and the confection of objects.














1969-1970 From Abbey Road to Let it be

In 1969, Paul McCartney is the object of an unbelievable rumor alleging he was killed in a car accident in November 1966 and had been replaced by a lookalike afterwards. The American DJ Russ Gibb began this rumor on October 12, 1969. This lookalike is currently called "Fail" for False Paul and would be a certain

"William Campbell", a young man who'd won a Paul McCartney lookalike contest. The clues are many, specially on the jacket of Abbey Road, which conspiracy theorists love to dissect: Paul is barefoot in the crosswalk, like the dead are buried in India. The white Volkswagen's license plate says "LMW 28 IF" - "Living

McCartney Would be 28", he's holding his cigarette in his right hand although he's left-handed... The list is long. The Beatles don't comment on the news, but in 1971, in the song "How do you sleep?", a harsh accusation of Paul. John sings "Those freaks was right when they said you was dead".























