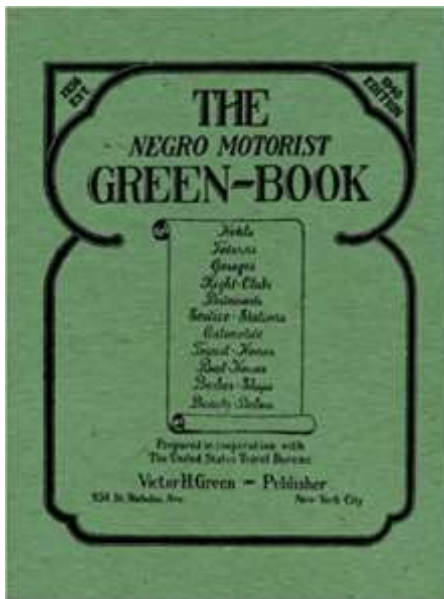

Racial segregation became the law in most parts of the American South until the Civil Rights Movement. These laws, known as Jim Crow laws, forced segregation of facilities and services, prohibited intermarriage, and denied suffrage. (right to vote)

- All persons licensed to conduct a restaurant, shall serve either white people exclusively or colored people exclusively and shall not sell to the two races within the same room or serve the two races anywhere under the same license. Georgia
- White and colored people can't be served in the same restaurant unless there are separate entrances for them and they are separated by a wall at least seven feet high (Alabama)
- White and colored audience members must sit in separate sections at any public hall, theatre, opera house, movie theatre, or place of public entertainment. (Virginia)
- Negroes and white persons are not allowed to play cards, dominoes, checkers, baseball, softball, football, basketball, or pool with each other. (Alabama)
- Every employer of white or negro males shall provide for such white or negro males reasonably accessible and separate toilet facilities. Alabama
